The written steps necessary to appropriately and uniformly perform a task in carrying out policies and activities of the College.

Overview/procedure description

The Board of Regents has adopted a Policy specifying the minimum degree requirements for academic faculty. This procedure describes the method for determining the discipline in which course credits and degrees must be held; and enables staff and administrators to certify faculty credentials.

Areas of Responsibility It is the responsibility of each incumbent academic faculty member and each applicant to provide evidence that he or she meets the minimum degree requirements. The Human Resources Office shall certify eligibility based solely upon the information provided by the faculty member or applicant for review. Acceptable evidence shall only include certified or official transcripts.

Procedure details

The Human Resources Office shall evaluate the transcripts and certifications provided by the incumbent faculty member or applicant, compare the degree(s) held and credit hours in each degree against minimum qualification requirements for the discipline or course category in which the faculty (or proposed faculty member) is or will be assigned. For General Education Courses; Baccalaureate Courses; and Associate Degree Courses designed for transfer into a baccalaureate degree program, the Human Resources Office shall compare the degree(s) and credit hours successfully completed against the requirements specified in the subject matter area set forth in the table below.
